Diltex is a company founded in 1949 dedicated to the design, production and marketing of products for women, such as underwear, outerwear, cosmetics and household items, under the brand name "Ilusión". In 1995 it began exporting to the United States, Central and South America. It currently has more than 200 shops in Mexico and sales through the catalogue system and online.

Etam is one of the largest intimate apparel groups in the world, while Fiorentina is a Mexican company founded in 2003 with the aim of offering unique designs in lingerie, loungewear, sportswear and swimwear.
